For these workshops we have invited stakeholders linked to children, health and/or education to meet and discuss the possibilities and implications for schools to optimise the care and support for HIV-affected children. Your inputs are exceptionally important to our work, so we invite you to please take your own institutions and experiences as a starting point - and bring forward your contributions to the discussion. After these workshops we will finalise a report with our research findings and include the input deriving from these workshops.
